Weekend

Outbound from Boston

Table of train schedules for Weekend Outbound from Boston. Columns include Saturday and Sunday train numbers and arrival times for lines 1701-1717 in AM and PM.

Schedules may change in the event of severe weather. Explains service levels: REGULAR SERVICE (normal schedule), STORM SERVICE (reduced schedule), NO SERVICE (no passenger service on Commuter Rail).

Times in purple with "f" indicate a flag stop: Passengers must tell the conductor that they wish to leave. Passengers waiting to board must be visible on the platform for the train to stop.

Times in blue with "L" indicate an early departure: The train may leave ahead of schedule at these stops.

Bikes: Bicycles are allowed on trains with the bicycle symbol shown below the train number.
